



Richard M. Tetreault was appointed Deputy Secretary of the Vermont Agency of Transportation in September 2015. Previously, Tetreault served as the Highway Division Director/Chief Engineer, and prior to that, as the Director/Chief Engineer of the Program Development Division since February 2005. Since receiving a B.S. in Civil Engineering from the University of Vermont, Tetreault has spent his entire professional career at the Agency of Transportation, working in many diverse capacities: Resident Engineer of Bridge and Airport projects; Engineer in a bridge design squad in the Structures Section; Chief Bridge Inspector, responsible for inspecting town and state owned bridges and culverts across the state; Maintenance Programs Engineer, managing the Agency's Buildings Program, ITS Program, District Engineering Support, and Local Grant Programs for Class II Town Highways and Structures; the Agency's Qualified Representative during emergencies at Vermont Emergency Management; State Public Assistance Officer for FEMA disaster declarations; and District Transportation Administrator.
