

IS-909 - COMMUNITY PREPAREDNESS: IMPLEMENTING SIMPLE ACTIVITIES FOR EVERYONE

The purpose of this course is to present a model program for community preparedness. This course is the overview for a 16 module, instructor lead interactive local activity. Modules run 20 – 90 minutes each and can be used individually. By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Identify the definition of preparedness
- Describe the role of individuals and households in preparedness
- Identify community preparedness principles
- Describe the purpose of community-based preparedness activities
- Identify the steps for planning and conducting a community-based preparedness program
- Identify resources for supporting community-based preparedness programs

WORKSHEET

A business impact analysis (BIA) predicts the consequences of disruption of a business function and process and gathers information needed to develop recovery strategies.

RISK ASSESSMENT TABLE

A business will conduct the risk assessment, look for vulnerabilities—weaknesses—that will make an asset more susceptible to damage from a hazard. Vulnerabilities include deficiencies in building construction, process systems, security, protection systems and loss prevention programs. They contribute to the severity of damage when an incident occurs.
