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## AOT Awards \$2M Million in Transportation Alternatives Grants for Vermont Communities

Barre, Vt. — The Vermont Agency of Transportation (AOT) today announced the recipients of more than \$2 million dollars in federal funds for municipal grant projects under the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP). This year's funding will be used for all TAP category types throughout Vermont.

The selected projects include:

- Bristol: Reconstruction of the storm drain system along Main Street.
- Tinmouth: Salt and sand shed.
- Burke:
- Wardsboro: Salt and sand shed.
- Milton: Salt and sand shed.
- Rutland: Improve bicycle/pedestrian safety.

- Hinesburg: Relocation of sidewalk and related crosswalk.
- Swanton: Improve bicycle and pedestrian traffic movements in the village center.
- Bennington: Shared use path.
- Moretown: Bicycle and pedestrian shared use path scoping study.
- Springfield: Bicycle and pedestrian shared use path scoping study.
- Rockingham: Intersection scoping study for a complete streets upgrade.
- Stowe: Bicycle and pedestrian shared use path scoping study.
- Putney: Bicycle and pedestrian shared use path scoping study.
- Killington: Bicycle and pedestrian shared use path scoping study.
- Johnson: Scoping Study for preservation of a historic bridge.
- Mendon: Scoping Study for improved bicycle and pedestrian traffic.
