TRAFFIC IMPACT

Paving work will take place next week at night starting at 7 PM on Monday.

The current schedule is as follows: Marble Works overnight on Monday, Merchants Row overnight on Tuesday, Main Street overnight on Wednesday. Water Street, the National Bank's Seymour Street branch, and the roadway alongside the new sidewalk on Seymour Street will be paved on one of these evenings.

Merchants Row will be closed to motorists during paving. Flaggers will manage traffic in and out of the Marble Works, and there will be alternating one-lane traffic on Main Street. This work is weather permitting.

CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Next week, construction crews will pave the roads in downtown Middlebury. Please see the above "Traffic Impacts" for a schedule of this work. Steel posts to support the rail platform canopy will be installed. A crane will operate along Middle Seymour Street to install the structures. Please keep an eye out for construction activity while driving in and out of the Marble Works. On the south end of the project, Kubricky anticipates removing the access road and restoring the stream bank along Otter Creek.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

The Town of Middlebury is holding a dedication ceremony for the new park in Printer's Alley on **Saturday, August 21 at 12 PM**. The park will be dedicated to the Lazarus family, whose department store occupied the site for most of the 20th century. A community-wide celebration will be held in Downtown Middlebury following the ceremony. If it's raining, the ceremony will be held in the Town Offices at 77 Main Street.
