State Fiscal Year 2015 - Grants awarded summer of 2014



The Vermont Better Backroads Program is pleased to announce its seventeenth year of funding to support projects on town or private roads that improve water quality and result in maintenance cost savings. The program began in 1997 and continued through 2012 and was administered by Northern Vermont Resource Conservation and Development Council. In 2013 the administration of the program was transferred to the Agency of Transportation. The grant funds are provided by the Vermont Agency of Transportation and the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources. The Vermont Better Backroads Program's goal is to promote the use of erosion control and maintenance techniques that save money while protecting and enhancing Vermont's lakes and streams. Funds, subject to availability, will be distributed as small grants to municipalities and local organizations to address town or private road erosion problems.



The Better Backroads Program is in its second year of transition into State Government. The program is housed in the Highway Municipal Assistance Bureau and is funded jointly by the Vermont Agency of Transportation (VTrans) and the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation (VTDEC). The program offers two types of grants to the municipalities. We have the Category (A) grant which is a planning grant for a maximum amount of \$4,000.00 and the Category (B) grant which is an implementation grant for a maximum amount of \$10,000.00, both with a 20% minimum match by the town. The goal of the program is to provide cost effective techniques to enhance maintenance of gravel roads while improving water quality.

This year we had (96) applications for a grant through the program. Out of the (96) we were able to fund (68) projects. For the (Cat A) planning grant there were (24) awarded, and for the (Cat B) implementation grant there were (41) awards. There were also (10) new towns to the program this year.

The program also reaches out to non-municipalities with funds from (VTDEC) which brings the total projects this year to (68). Technical assistance is offered through the program to all applicants. 



Better Backroads in the News

St. Johnsbury gets 'Better Back Roads' thanks to grant

ST. JOHNSBURY - The St. Johnsbury Public Works Department has completed a \$16,000 grant project to improve Dahlberg Road.

The job included 700 feet of ditch upgrades, new culverts and rip-rap, said Public Works Director Hugh Wescott. The dead end dirt road is located off River Road, which is also dirt.

Improvements are meant to curb runoff problems that generated frequent washouts on River Road, Wescott said. And washouts deposit sediments into the nearby Passumpsic River, he said.

"The road couldn't take the water and would washout," Wescott said. Improvements were funded by the Better Back Roads Program. The program provided a \$10,000 grant and St. Johnsbury footed the remainder with in-kind services like materials and labor.

We cott said the project would not have occurred without the grant. "We get a grant to take care of a problem road, where otherwise we wouldn't have money to improve them," Wescott said.

He plans to complete a Better Back Roads project annually. The program last year was used to improve a section of Mooney Road.

Erosion control project completed in Corinth

completed in Corinth Cornth Completed in Corinth Highway Department has completed another erosion control project funded by Better Backroads.

The project consisted of replacing two culverts near the intersection of Magoon Hill Road and Juniper Chase and armoring the collection ditch above Juniper Chase and the ditch along Magoon Hill Road. Over the years runoff had silted in the collection area above the first culvert and deeply eroded the roadside ditch to a depth of over six feet, which at times had threatened to wash out Magoon Hill Road below Juniper Chase.

The crew filled the eroded roadside ditch, laid erosion control fabric and lined the ditch with heavy erosion stone. Brush and silt was cleared out of the collection ditch above Juniper Chase and it was lined with stone. The heavy stone reduces the velocity of the runoff and dissipates the energy of the flow, reducing the threat of washouts and erosion. This work will protect town infrastructure and eliminate the silt runoff that degrades local trout streams.

The Vermont Agency of Transportation's Better Backroads grant program is in its 17th year of helping towns reduce damage and erosion on local gravel roads. The grants pay for 80 percent of the collection which can be offset by using town labor and equipment.

Road Improvements in Benson

The Town of Benson has just completed a 1100' stone lined ditch on the west side of Sunset Lake Road, along the section of the road that collapsed last winter. This section of Sunset Lake Road is ledge and the water had been running beneath the road, undermining the road. By getting the water below the ledge and controlling the kinetic energy of the water with 6"-12" rip rap, the road will be safer. At the same time, this project is beneficial to Lake Champlain: the runoff from this section of the road flows into the Hubbardton River which flows into Lake Champlain. Lowering phosphorus flow into the Hubbardton River helps lower the flow into Lake Champlain. \$10,000 of this project was funded by a Better Backroads grant.

West Windsor Highway Department Completes Stabilization Project

With grant funding provided by Better Backroads, the West Windsor Highway Department stabilized three sections of eroding stream bank along Knob Hill Road. The Better Backroads program has been working with towns and nonprofit organizations to correct road-related erosion problems and improve water quality since 1997. The Knob Hill Road project was a collaborative effort involving Better Backroads, the West Windsor Highway Department, and Dan Lesnick Excavating (DLX). "I would like to thank Better Backroads for funding this project," said West Windsor Road Foreman Michael Spackman. This project will improve water quality, protect the road and the stream bank, and prevent material from washing into the stream.

"Projects like these save us money in the end because we don't have to go back year after year and keep shoring up the stream bank when it erodes" Spackman said.
